FEES: For stalls - \$6.00 per head will be charge for each animal, to be paid when entries are made.

Grooming stands are to be paid for through the entry department.

RULES:

1. **REFER TO ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS**
2. **Pending will not be accepted for registration information.**
3. **Incorrect or incomplete entry forms will be returned to sender.**
4. The same sheep cannot be entered in two (2) different exhibitors' names in both the open and junior shows.
5. All animals, regardless of age, must be registered in their respective breed associations and must bear breeder's and association tags. Purchased animals must have transfer recorded at least 30 days before the Fair; there will be no exception to this rule.
6. Flock number, birthdate and sire and dam (with their registration numbers) must be listed on the entry form.
7. Senior lambs of **all breeds** (Border Cheviot, North Country Cheviot, Dorset, Hampshire, Southdown, Suffolk, All Other Purebreds – Meat Breeds and All Other Purebreds – Wool Breeds) must be born September 1 – January 1. Junior lambs of all breeds (Border Cheviot, Dorset, Hampshire, Southdown, Suffolk, All Other Purebreds – Meat Breeds and All Other Purebreds – Wool Breeds) must be born on or after January 1 of current year.

8. All sheep oiled or blackened shall be excluded from competition.
9. **No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two (2) premiums in one (1) class.**
10. Only one (1) entry from an exhibitor will be accepted in classes 5, 9, 13, 16, 17, 18 & 19.
11. All animals entered in the Sheep Classes, except lambs six (6) months or under, must be registered in the recognized American Herd Books of their respective breeds. Sheep six (6) months of age or under must be eligible for registration.
12. **Management reserves the right to adjust and combine classes and divisions as appropriate.**
13. **Sheep must have a Tag ID to show at the State Fair of West Virginia.**

Shepherd's Lead Competition

For Guys and Gals

Tuesday, August 14, 2018, 5 p.m. - Small Stock Arena

The objective is to present a class of sheep in the most attractive manner; to give spectators an opportunity to view a classes of beauty; to improve the image of a sheep show; and to promote the sheep and wool industry.

Premiums

1st - \$40.00 2nd - \$35.00 3rd - \$30.00 4th - \$25.00 5th - \$20.00

CLASSES

1. Juniors - 6 to 10 years of age
2. Juniors - 11 to 14 years of age
3. Intermediate - 14 to 21 years of age
4. Adults - Over 21 years of age

Exhibitors will be judged according to the following: exhibitor's costume, control, presentation of animal and appearance of ewe.

RULES:

1. Sheep must be registered yearling ewes or registered ewe lambs, conditioned fitted and trained to show at halter.
2. Any animal entered must meet the health requirements. No animal may be brought onto the fairgrounds solely for the purpose of being used in the Shepherd's Lead Competition. If you enter the Shepherd's Lead Competition and do not have a sheep that meets these requirements, an effort will be made to provide one for you.
3. The Shepherd's Lead Competition may be entered by the July 6 deadline in either the open show or the junior purebred sheep show. **Exhibitors may also enter the competition the day of.**
4. Exhibitor outfits **MUST BE AT LEAST 50% WOOL.**
5. Exhibitor must provide their own outfit, but the outfit does not have to be hand-made.
6. Each contestant must report to the Small Stock Arena by 1:30 pm for rehearsal the day of the contest with typed, NOT HANDWRITTEN, copy of the contestant's biographical information. Please include your name, hometown, information about the outfit you plan to wear, past fair experiences and any other anecdotes you would like to include.
7. **Absolutely no one under the age of six (6) years old will be allowed in the show ring for any reason during the Shepherd's Lead Competition.**
8. Management reserves the right to re-divide the classes based on the ages and number entered. Management also reserves the right to cancel this activity if fewer than (5) entries are received.

Divisions 10 A & B - Wool

Purpose: The objectives of this exhibit are to encourage the production of high quality wool, to stimulate interest in the proper preparation of wool for market (both commercially and to hand spinners) and to reward exhibitors for high quality fleeces.

Check-in: by 6:00 p.m., Thursday, August 9, 2018
Judging: Friday, August 10, 8:30 a.m.

Rules:

1. All wool exhibits must be in place in the Tractor Supply Small Stock Arena by 6:00 p.m., Thursday, August 9, 2018. All wool will be placed in plastic bags (provided by the Fair). **Please tell us the breed which the wool came from on your entry form.**
2. No entry fees will be charged on fleeces entered for competition.
3. Fleeces must be entered in the name of the grower.
4. Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries in any class, however, no fleece can compete in more than one (1) class.
5. Each fleece must have been shorn in 2018 and represent no more than 12 months growth, except yearling fleeces, which 16 month growth will be allowed.
6. Any fleece entered in competition should be clean, free of vegetable contamination, dung locks or tags and show no evidence of moths. It should be properly skirted and tied with a paper twine, flesh side out, in a manner to allow it to be handled without falling apart.
7. In case of controversy relative to classification of a fleece, affidavits from the exhibitor may be required. However, in all such controversies and in any interpretation of these rules and regulations, the decision of a committee, to consist of the wool show superintendent and a board of director of the SFWV, shall be final.
8. Fleeces may not be removed from the show arena until 6:00 p.m., Saturday, August 18, 2018.
9. Exhibitors must enter fleece competition on the official open show entry form by the official entry deadline.
10. **Exhibitors will receive two admission tickets per entry.**
11. Premiums will be offered in both Division 10A and Division 10B for all classes.
